2. President Johnson thanked all the departments that submitted and attended the annual Valor Awards Breakfast on September 12, 2023, at Manna Church. It was a great event. A copy of the annual booklet is in everyone's packet.
3. Another reminder about our upcoming Public Safety Day coming up on the 30th of September from 1100 until 1500 hours in the parking lot of the old Gander Mountain Store on Skibo Road.
4. All Spectrum Internet reimbursement checks for all departments that have submitted the required reimbursement documentation are in your packets.

6. President Johnson thanked the members that came out for the telecommunicators hiring event and assisted with the process.
7. President Johnson reminded and urged the membership to support the annual Captain Archie Cox Golf Tournament coming up this Friday September 29, 2023, starting at 9 AM at Kings Grant Country Club. A flyer is in everyone's packet.
8. President Johnson announced that association Secretary Fort Liberty Fire Chief Mark Melvin was officially retired by Fort Liberty on Wednesday September 20, 2023. He received a tremendous retirement sent off.
9. President Johnson is looking into replacing our 8th edition tablets with either the 10th or latest edition. Programs associated with our tasks are constantly changing their platform and we need to be able to accommodate running required programs on our tablets. This will require everyone to return their tablet back to the association, whereas there will be a buy back option. We will, however, trade tablet for tablet. In order to facilitate this procurement President Johnson needs all the Chiefs to send him the serial and phone number of each CFCA funded tablet to verify our inventory. Our current inventory roster was changed by ATT, and we need to correct the inventory roster for accountability purposes. Those not accounted for will be cut off at the end of October.
10. President Johnson reminded all those departments that applied for the ARP Non-Profit Funds and were approved should have received their contract. If not, please call the County.
11. The Employee Retention Tax Credit (ERTC) is closing soon. If you have full time firefighters and have not applied for ERTC you should consider. Several of our stations have applied for and have received their ERTC refunds.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. President Johnson stated he only received one (1) request to replace our retired association Secretary Fire Chief Mark Melvin. Fort Liberty Assistant Chief Josh Hopkins sent an email exhibiting interest in the position. His consideration email is in everyone's packet. Chief Hopkins has the blessing from Chief McGuire to serve as our secretary. President Johnson stated unless there is an objection, he will appoint Chief Hopkins to complete Chief Melvin's term expiring in May 2024. He thanked Chief Hopkins for his consideration and acceptance to serve as our secretary.
2. President Johnson announced that Representative Dianne Wheatley secured a \$100,000.00 SCIF grant funds for the association for sustainment for AED and related equipment program. Please say thank you to Representative Wheatley and Senator Tom McGinnes who supported the initiative and budget.
3. Also in the State Budget resolution is funding for foam. The General Assembly voted to include \$20,000,000 to replace PFAS foam. We are waiting for additional information from the Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM).
4. All the VFDs should have received a notice from our Association Attorney Mr. Yarborough about his firm moving to 310 Dick Street, Suite "A" effective October 5, 2023. Cumberland

County purchased his property through condemnation to make space for the new Performing Arts Center.

- 5 President Johnson congratulated Fort Liberty Deputy Fire Chief Scott McGurie to his current appointment as interim Fort Liberty Fire Chief for the next 120 days.
- 6 President Johnson thanked the departments that came out and supported the “Everyone Goes Home” class last week September 20, 2023, at Fayetteville State University. It was a short fuse notification. Assistant Chief Richtmeyer advised that about forty (40) attended the seminar with several from out of town.
- 7 President Johnson presented Senator Kirk deViere with his official white honorary fire chief helmet. Senator de-Viere secured a \$1,000,000.00 SCIF grant for the association during his term



of office. He was also extremely active in the association, attending meetings throughout his term and keeping the association abreast of Legislative Affairs. He was appointed an honorary fire chief during the December 2023 Christmas meeting. However, due to supply issues the Franciscan presentation helmet was on back order.

- SCIF Committee Chairman Keith Matthews on behalf of his committee presented the committee's recommendation for the FY 23-24 SCIF project year. He also provided information on submitted projects recommendation and related discussion. The Committee's project recommendation for the Fiscal Year 23-24 is to purchase 1000 feet of 5" Large Diameter Hose (LDH) for the fifteen (15) volunteer fire district. Of the three (3) bids received Fire Connections provided the low bid of \$764.40 per one hundred (100) feet, for a total of \$114,660.00 without the required \$8,026.20 Sales Tax. Total project price is \$122,686.20, which is well within the \$125,000.00 fiscal year project limit. After a discussion SCIF Committee Chairman Matthews asked the membership to approve or disapprove.

Vander Fire District Fire Chief Richard Bradshaw introduced a **MOTION** to adopt the recommendation from the SCIF committee and purchase 1000 feet of Key-Line Pro-Flow 5" LDH for each volunteer fire district from Fire Connections for total purchase price of \$122,686.20 including applicable taxes. (Shipping is not included) The **MOTION** was **SECONDED** by Eastover Fire District Fire Chief Scott Makenzie and unanimously **APPROVED** by a roll call vote. 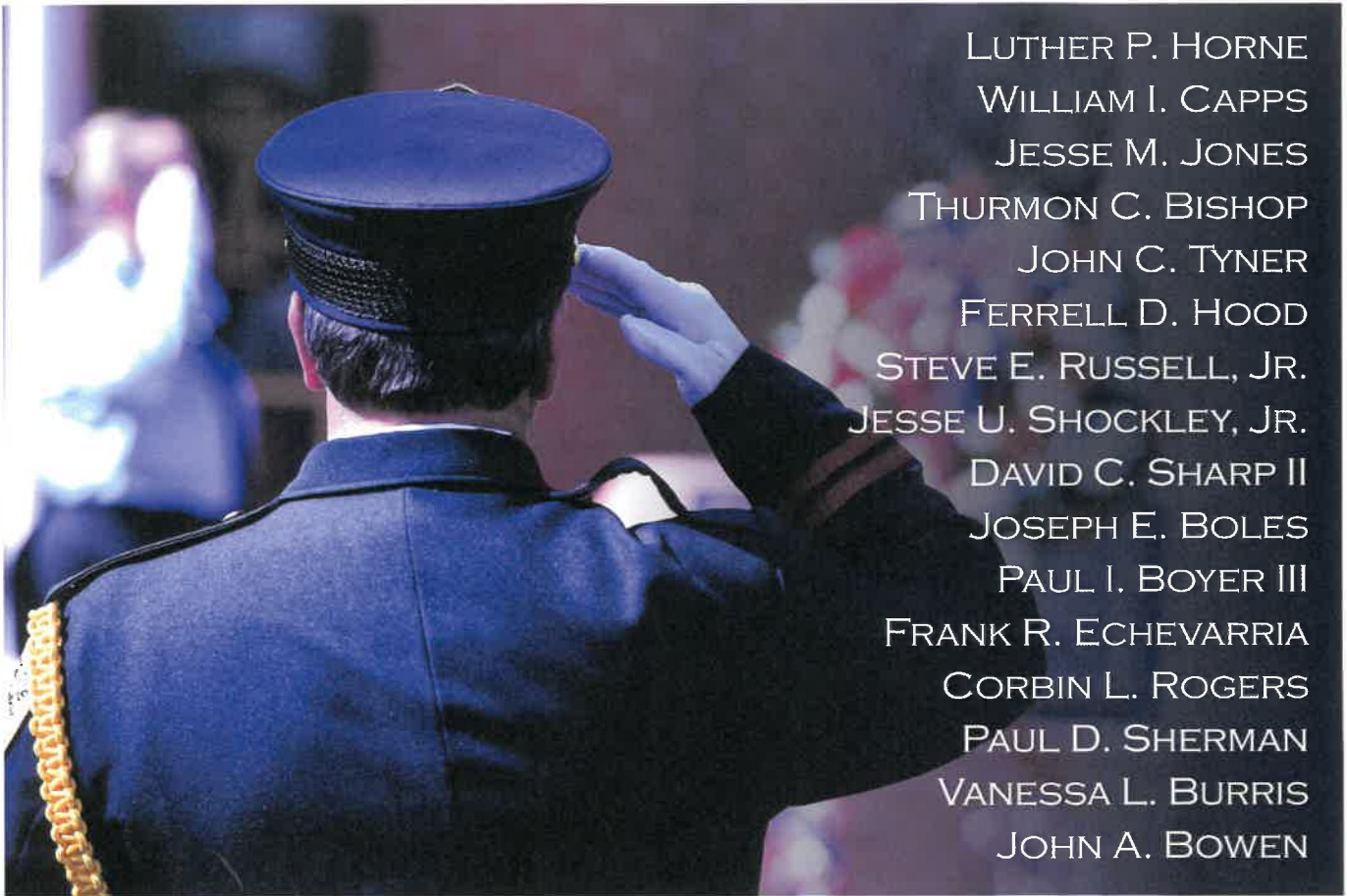

When the job was done the box was reset and 5-5-5 "tapped out" signaling assignment complete, returning to quarters.

In keeping with tradition, we now ring out 5-5-5 honoring our fallen brother, his assignment complete, returned to quarters and reassigned to the Chief Shepherd receiving his well done.

Minutes of the September 6, 2023, **SCIF** Committee Meeting



Call to Order:

The Fiscal Year 23-24 SCIF meeting was called to order by Committee Chairman Chief Matthews at 1405 Hours. The meeting was conducted at the new Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC) Regional Fire and Rescue Training Center.

1. Chairman Matthews opened the meeting and asked Chief Johnson to provide a quick overview of our administrative funding rules, limits and the required SCIF protocols.
2. Chief Johnson announced that a total of \$125,000.00 was available for projects to our State Capital Infrastructure Fund (SCIF) Committee for the 2023-24 Fiscal Year. The committee is expected to keep minutes of all meetings and as part of our purchasing process acquire a minimum of three (3) vendor bids. (Unless the item is a single source vendor). Our available project SCIF funds will be exhausted over a four (4) to five (5) year period. This is our 2nd project year.
 - Once the committee agrees on a project proposal, the project needs to be announced to the CCFCA membership at a duly called association meeting. The association will officially adopt or reject the proposal.
 - Chief Johnson also stated that some of our funds in future project years will need to be expended for our overall county-wide community risk reductions programs. (Fire Life Safety Education (FLSE) programs (Public Fire Education) that will benefit all our agencies.
3. Chairman Matthews opened the floor for project recommendations. Only one (1) recommendation was received via E-Mail.
 - ❖ Chairman Matthews informed the members that both Stedman Fire Chief Justin Nobles and Grays Creek #18 Fire Chief Logan Herndon submitted a proposal via E-Mail asking the committee to consider the purchase of two (2) Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) Fit testing machines. One (1) for the east side of the county and one (1) for the west side. Chief Gary Brock, Beaver Dam VFD inquired about Drones and I-PADs and Chief Ronnie Marley inquired about RIT packs.

- ❖ Committee Member Logan Herndon recommended a 5" LDH project providing each Volunteer Fire District with 1000 feet of 5" LDH.
- ❖ Chief Johnson Sr. also mentioned a couple of optional projects if the committee wants to consider the purchase of a Personal Protective Ensemble (PPE) or even mobile radios. Both are high priced items.

4. Chairman Matthews called for discussion on the submitted and recommended committee members projects.

Fire Chief Herndon discussed Key Line Hose and provided low bid pricing quotes from Fire Connections at \$764.40 per one-hundred feet. The quoted price includes a large bulk purchase discount. 150 sections (15,000 feet) would run about \$114,660.00 plus tax for a total of \$122,686.20, which is well within our budget limit. This project would provide 1000 feet of Large Diameter 5" Hose to every volunteer fire district. A general and lengthy discussion amongst all members followed. Additional Bids received from Atlantic Emergency Services at \$764.68 and Fire Hose Direct \$936.69 per one hundred feet.

Committee members also addressed the remaining recommendations and further discussed the Fit testing machine recommendation. The current price for a viable FIT testing machine with all the required accessories is around \$13 to 16,000.00. A discussion amongst members highlighted that several districts already have their own FIT testing machines across the county. (Cumberland Road, Fayetteville, Grays Creek # 18, Stoney Point and Westarea) After a discussion amongst all committee members, the committee decided to re-examine the FIT testing machines as well as other recommendations during the Fiscal Year 24-25 project year. At that time **Fire Chief Logan Herndon** made a **MOTION** that the committee move forward with a recommendation to the association members during the September 25, 2023, meeting in Godwin-Falcon to outfit each volunteer fire department with 1000 feet of Key-line hose from Fire Connections. The **Motion** was **SECONDED** by Chief Richard Bradshaw and **APPROVED** by all committee members present. Chief Herndon submitted the required quotes.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made to adjourn by Chief Logan Herndon and seconded by Deputy Hank Harris. The meeting was adjourned at 1520 hours.
