OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. President Johnson formally invited all our retirees, and for their commitment and dedication also invited all honor guard members to the annual association Christmas dinner hosted by Sherriff Wright.
- 2. President Johnson discussed the foam replacement process for the three county foam trailers. A quote has been requested from a Green Foam Dealer. We are waiting for their response to be able to move forward with this purchase.
- 3. President Johnson discussed AED update. 98 AED's have been delivered to Director Booth. We are still waiting for 4 additional batteries to complete the order. Director Booth advised that a number of batteries are already dead so more will be required before the County can re-issue the old AED's. This leaves a total of 120 AED to be turned into the County.
- 3. President Johnson addressed the membership on our First Due RMS Implementation Update which is up and running and moving forward. IAMRESPONDING will conclude on the 30th of Nov. President Johnson is asking all departments to finalize their accounts and to set it up for an automatic data download at the end of each month as exampled in your packet for run statistics. There was a sheet for each departments' data that was passed around to set up this account through First Due RMS.
- 4. NCAFC-MWC-2025 North Carolina Association of Fire Chiefs Mid-Winter-Conference (MWC) Wednesday January 29 through Saturday February 1st, 2025. All registration and room reservations have been completed.

Low Tier Wade Community FD – Chief D. Hill (Declined due to conflict) Chief Hank Harris from Cottom FD will take his place.

Mid-Tier Cumberland Road FD – Chief S. Parrish High Tier Pearce's Mill FD – Chief T. Smith

- 5. President Johnson reminded members about the Arnold J. Koonce award window which is currently open until the 2nd of December at 5 pm. All Fire, Rescue, EMS, Emergency Management, Dispatchers and Fire Marshal Offices are encouraged to submit eligible nominations. At this moment, only a few submissions have been given. Awards will be given to the Firefighter and Fire Officer of the year at the Annual Christmas meeting. An award will also be given to Jimmy Keefe, our outgoing Fire Commissioner.
- 6. President Johnson reminded the Chiefs that a motion was put forward by the Finance Committee for the renewal of our Truist CD at last month's meeting. It has been renewed for another 5 months. Since it was reinstated, the account has accrued about \$36,000 in interest.
- 7. The IAR Contract expires on the 30th of November at midnight. However, individual departments can most certainly renew their agency, costs run about \$500.00 annually. Please use the First Due Information Form in your packet to update your required minimum information for all your chief officers and return asap to complete this important step. This information will be entered into the CCFCA account.
- 8. Both the Chiefs Association Audit with Haigh, Byrd, and Lambert as well as our SCIF Yellow-Book Audits have been completed and will be picked up and turned into County Finance / Internal Audit. He reminded the Chiefs in the audience that IAW, our County Contract all Annual Audits are due to County Finance / Internal Audit by the last working day in December 2024. This requirement is directly related to your grant submissions eligibility.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. President Johnson drew attention to a letter that each member should have received from the North Carolina State Firefighters Association. This notice concerns the Senate Bill 319 that addresses the Cancer Benefit Program. It is imperative that retirees remain on their departments roster in order to receive the cancer benefits after they retire. Effective July 1, 2025, place all your retiree in a retired-inactive category on your department rosters. This will protect our retirees. (There will be no fee for retirees)
- 2. President Johnson also drew attention to the NCSFA annual certification period that begins on 1 December and must be completed by the 15th of January 2025.
- 3. President Johnson requested assistance from an individual within our county departments that can join a FTCC EMS Advisory Committee. The selectee will only need to attend 2 meetings a

- year either in person or online. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss EMS training and Con-Ed training. Call Pamela Lowther or President Johnson if you are interested in participating.
- 4. President Johnson drew attention to the First Due form from Grays Creek #24. This report is an example of what needs to be set up for each department. A report is created automatically and downloaded by the 20th of each month or whatever date you choose. <u>First Due</u> also creates the ability for this report to be generated automatically and emailed to pre-set email addresses. This report will assist us in generating our monthly year-to-date incident reports.
- 5. President Johnson with the assistance of Chief Richtmeyer discussed the Unified Man-Power board that is currently in use. All units have been provided the new system to date. A new video link has been provided in your email on the use of the system. He further highlighted that the Manpower function at a major incident is a mandatory function.
- 6. President Johnson again reminded everyone of Fire Chief Ronnie Marley's retirement ceremony which is now scheduled on Saturday the 11th of Jan at 4pm at the Pearce's Mill FD. Chief Ronnie Marley is currently and has been serving for the past 22 years as our association's Vice President. Chief Marley has officially announced his plans to retire effective January 1, 2025, after 51 years of public service to the Pearce's Mill Fire District also encompassing our local municipalities, Cumberland County, and the Great State of North Carolina. Chiefs are encouraged to please put this important date on your calendar and join PMFD for Ronnie's farewell retirement. Ronnie has requested induction as a lifetime honorary CCFCA member. Please RSVP to Interim Fire Chief Tracy Smith if you plan on attending to account for food.

- > TRUIST statement is in your packet along with the profit and loss report.
- > Current balance as of tonight is \$467,467.63
- ➤ SCIF Funds as of Nov 25, 2024. From the original 1-million-dollar grant, \$602, 870.96 has been spent leaving a balance remaining of \$397,130.00. We have set aside \$250,000 for our environmentally green foam purchase. Unless we encounter some sort of emergency, the remaining balance, along with the interest earned, should provide us with 2 more annual projects. One in 2025 and one in 2026.
- ➤ 2024 Year end project status: All circular saws are in. Rescue saws were short by 4. The EV plugs are on back order. We have until the June 2026 to exhaust the SCIF Grant.
- > The \$100,000 EMS Grant was received on the 17th of Oct which will be used for EMS supplies and EMS equipment only. These are considered restricted funds and cannot be used for anything other than EMS supplies.

<u>FIRE LIFE SAFETY EDUCATION COMMITTEE</u> – Fire Marshall Kevin Lowther Chairperson, Email -klowther@cumberlandcountync.gov

- Fire Marshal Kevin Lowther that the South River Grant Submission Application was approved and we have received the funds.
- ➤ More CO/Smoke Detectors are still available if anyone needs them. Please reach out to Mr. Lowther if you have any needs.
- > The team is still working on the GIS overlay to assist with identifying smoke detector needs and specific location.
- ➤ Grant money was received through the CCFCA to provide PR Events and education materials to 10 Public school events. This has been a great success. Only two schools remain to be scheduled.
- National Fire Safety Council program presented. The program seeks to assist departments in obtaining educational material due to zero cost to the county. The hinderance is that governmental organizations are not authorized to solicit funds from the community. However, Fire Marshall Lowther proposed that the program be submitted and maintained under the purview of the CCFCA.
- > Proposal presented from the Committee to use CCFCA Letterhead and request for the program to move forward.
- President Johnson stated that he used the National Fire Safety Council program in Hoke County for years and never received a complaint. The letter that went out to the various businesses in Hoke County was signed by him and the City of Raeford Fire Marshal. All safety material was sent directly to the various schools and really worked well.

- After a brief discussion, a <u>MOTION</u> was introduced by Fire Chief Scott Bass (Westarea Fire Department) that the association support the efforts of our FLSE committee using the CCFCA as sponsor, which will provide for a county-wide lobbying area. The <u>MOTION</u> was <u>SECONDED</u> Deputy Fire Chief Tracy Smith, (Pearce's Mill Fire Department) and unanimously <u>APPROVED</u> by all members present via a roll-call vote.

Fire at Eastover motel on Sunday leads to the arrest of couple who lived there

A Fayetteville couple was arrested Wednesday on allegations they set fire to an Eastover motel Sunday.

Marybeth Ann Floyd, 50, and Sandy Lavern Floyd, 64, are each charged with burning an occupied commercial structure, breaking and entering and conspiracy to burn a structure.

According to the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office, the Eastover Fire Department responded just before 6:30 a.m. Sunday to a fire at Cloverleaf Motel, 1353 Dobbin Holmes Road.

The arrest warrants allege that the couple broke into the building and set the occupied motel on fire. The warrants list their home address as Room 4 at the Cloverleaf Motel.

The Floyds are being held in the Cumberland County jail with secured bail set at \$50,000 each.

On Sunday, November 24, 2024, Brandon THOMPSON was arrested and charged with Misuse of the 911 System. He was processed at the Cumberland County Detention Center, where he received a \$1,000.00 secured bond for his charges.

THOMPSON made numerous false and misleading emergency calls to the Cumberland County Emergency Communications Center (9-1-1) since August 12, 2024. During the investigation, it was discovered that the defendant's cell phone was used to report approximately forty-two calls for service. Out of the forty-two calls, seventeen were proven to be false reports of structure and woods fires in the Pearce's Mill, Fayetteville, Hope Mills, and Spring Lake Fire Districts within Cumberland County. THOMPSON's actions elicited responses from multiple fire departments, which tied up valuable resources and put the lives of the public and emergency personnel at risk.


