OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. President Johnson discussed the foam replacement process for the 2 county foam trailers is on hold until after the first of the year. OSFM has been designated to spearhead the replacement project with funds going to OSFM. There should be movement on this project after the first of the year. President Johnson reminded the members that Foam 1 is empty and should not be dispatched. It is listed out of service in CAD. Foam 2 Fayetteville FD and Foam 3 Stedman FD are both in service for county-wide response.
- 2. President Johnson discussed the Fire Safety House wrap project has run into a few roadblocks with local vendors not wanted to tackle the project. He is still looking for new opportunities.
- 3. President Johnson wanted to thank all the Chiefs that came out and supported the Swift Water Center ribbon cutting. All are encouraged to reach out to Captain Bartch to schedule training and certification classes. Steve Drew from FTCC advised that Chiefs are welcome to connect with him to orchestrate and opportunity to participate.
- 4. President Johnson expressed appreciation for those that have submitted nominations for the Arnold J. Koonce Legacy Award. There are two awards that will be honored: one for a Firefighter and Fire Officer of the year. Presentations will be conducted in conjunction with our December 18, 2023, Christmas meeting at the Sheriff's Office.
- 5. President Johnson discussed the details of the Mid-Winter Conference in Concord, NC beginning on the 30th of January. Chief Nobels from Stedman FD #23, Chief Marsh from Grays Creek #24 and Chief Bradshaw from Vande FD #2 will be representing the CCFCA. All related coordination for registration and lodging have been mitigated by the association, including extra banquet tickets for a guest for each Chief.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Brian Taylor is going to be appointed the new State Fire Marchall effective January 1st of 2024. DOI only provides HR and Budgetary support. OSFM's budget comes from insurance proceeds. We will reach out to Brian to attend a future meeting to brief the association on the new OSFM organizational mission.
- 2. President Johnson outlined the POC change for FTCC EMS/Paramedic and CPR training. Dr. Marsh's email with contact information can be found in your respective packets.
- 3. Chief Ferguson has been working diligently on replacing our defective AED pads originally received from Zoll. Three lot numbers were distributed to the Cumberland County Chiefs for removal from service. At this point, all are still encouraged to review current pads and report issues if found. Please contact Chief Ferguson to replace the bad pads. He is also working with the company Vice-President on the systemic battery issues.
- 4. President Johnson announced that with the implementation of a Cumberland County Fire Service Hall of Fame back in 2020, several key members of the Cumberland County Fire Service have been appointed. A wall display will be created at the Regional Fire and Rescue Training Center that will display the Hall of Fame recipients. A copy of the Hall of Fame rules and guidelines has been included in everyone's packet. He also stated that he will submit both

former Fire Chief / Fire Marshal Arnold J. Koonce, and Fire Chief / Emergency Management Director John McGinnis to be posthumously appointed. Chief Koonce established the CCFCA in 1960 and served as president for 10 years, and introduced the water haul system within the state to lower ISO ratings. Chief McGinnis served as the associations 2nd President and also served for nearly ten years before being appointed Emergency Management Coordinator serving all of Cumberland County. The award recognizes individuals who's dedicated contributions go beyond their own fire district and benefit the entire Cumberland County and or the North Carolina Fire Service. Current inductees are Chief Kevin Herdon (50 Years) and two term association VP and President. Chief Piner (38 years), officially brought the Fayetteville Fire Department into the CCFCA and served as President of the North Carolina Association of Fire Chiefs a statewide organization. These awards will be presented each year during the annual Valor awards in October.

6. Chief Johnson reviewed the ID information sheet in each packet. He expounded that a photo and information sheet will be required for each ID requested. Training Officer Meeting – 8 November 2023

A meeting of the county training officers was held at the Regional Fire Training Facility on 8 November at 1900 hours. All present were introduced and a sheet was passed to get contact information for future communication.

Kevin Murphy discussed the following:

580G Program

- Paul Ward was supposed to come and speak with us. He was directed not to
- Below is what he shared with me during two phone conversations:
- The program is supposed to go into effect on 1 January.
 - Still in a state of flux
 - OSFM has not finalized it.

- Synopsys

- The fire departments will train their firefighters on designated subjects.
- The firefighter takes a comprehensive test and completes practical exercises.
- o If successful, Firefighter I&II is awarded.
- o An authorized instructor must do training.
 - What is an authorized instructor?
- What are the subjects and hour requirements haven't been designated yet?
- o How do we account for the training?
 - Standard forms
 - Drill sheets
 - Hasn't been determined.
- o Fire Ops 9 must be done in the classroom.
 - Fire control
 - Includes live burn operations.

Advantages

- We train our own.
- Time requirements can be controlled by the fire department.
- o Monitor the firefighter progress in-house.
- o More emphasis

- We can gear our recruit training programs to include the rudiments of 580G.
 - This way our firefighters don't duplicate effort and time.
- Disadvantages
 - o Currently, we don't have all the information.
 - References
 - Practical lists
 - Delay in aligning our recruit training programs.
- Recommendation
 - Formally request a briefing from the state in January
 - o "Go to Meeting" rather than cheeks in the seats

Discussion followed.

Steve Drew provided the following information on the 580G program:

Individual firefighters will be cleared but not certified by the AHJ. The cleared firefighter can challenge test the program at this point (practical's and written exam). Successful completion of the challenge test results in Firefighter I&II certification. Steve read from the Certification Committee minutes that indicated the program is at their level, but no action has been taken.

Everyone present was asked if they were receiving the training opportunities sent out monthly by Kevin Murphy? All indicated that they were.

The quorum was asked if there were any training issues or if they had any specific training needs. No one stated that they were having any issues, nor did they indicate any specific training needs.

Kevin Murphy raised the subject of intermediate classes and training. This training would bridge the gap from basic courses and align with the needs of our seasoned and senior firefighters. Discussion followed. Steve Drew discussed this topic and is willing to set classes of this nature, but needs an audience to support this initiative. Jon Faircloth was interested in this type of class. Steve stated that the college has an incident management simulator that could be integrated into these classes. Shane O'Neal stated that FFD and others would be interested. Kevin Murphy stated that the

college has driving and pump simulators which are available to all departments.

Ray Lloyd stated that we need more wildland firefighting training throughout the county. Discussion followed. Coordination for this training can be made through Ranger Craig Gottfied.

Mike Bartch briefed the water training programs and classes available to the fire departments. Mike discussed the water training facility, gave an overview of the facility and indicated what classes can be offered. He stated that he can do tailored training for departments to include throw bag, and truck company operations, Gear is not an issue and can be obtained through the training center. He discussed the tuition issue and stated that grants are available to cover costs. He further stated that the Chief's Association is working on assisting in funding the tuition. The training will cover everything from throw bags to swift water. Mike has interfaced with Chief Johnson on funding. Mike has a skill sheet that was developed for FFD to bring their firefighters up to speed for basic water rescue. He will tailor a skill sheet for your department. He indicated that there are functions that need to be done that don't require RT water certification. This training will bring participants to basic skills standards recognized throughout the county. Mike provided a tour of the water building.

Kevin Murphy stated that our next meeting will be virtually to reduce travel time and schedule disruption.

The meeting was adjourned at 1948 hours.

FACT SHEET

TENDER TASK FORCE

This fact sheet provides information to the Chiefs on the existing tender task force and potential, future courses of action to modify current configurations to increase efficiency and better serve the county. It further serves to solicit Chief's comments and input.

The current configuration provides 19,000 gallons of water within 30 minutes of alert. It includes large capacity tenders from the following departments: Cumberland County - Vander, Wade, Grays Creek(18), Grays Creek (24). Robeson County – Big Marsh, Lumber Bridge. Moore County – Crains Creek.

The tender task force concept requests the departments' tender and a driver. This prevents stripping the department of available manpower, especially during the daytime hours.

New tenders have been placed in service within Cumberland County. Bethany and Beaver Dam have large volume tenders that can augment the tender task force. Stoney Point and Westarea have large volume tenders ordered which should arrive in 2024 and could also be included once in service.

Several points need address, clarification and consideration to increase efficiency:

- 1. The current configuration provides 19,000 gallons of water. The task force was built large enough to ensure adequate water could be mustered and moved to support a large fire or incident in areas with limited water. Is 19,000 gallons too much or too little for these types of incidents?
- 2. With the new tenders, should we reconfigure the task force and alleviate the outof-county tankers?
- 3. Should we leave the configuration as is?
- 4. Should we relook the concept and set up two or more task forces within the county tailored to meet the supported fire department needs?

Courses of Action (4)

- 1. Leave the current tender task force as is.
 - (+) Already set up, has sufficient water, already tested and proven, 19,000 gallons of water, requires no CAD reconfiguration
 - (-) Timely (30 minutes to close on-site), may draw from departments already dispatched to the incident, requires coordination of radio frequencies and availability

- 2. Leave the current tender task force as is and add the new tankers to increase the available water.
 - (+) Available tenders would increase the water by 6,000 gallons, draws solely from Cumberland County units, allows additional tenders if other assigned units are unavailable.
 - (-) Draws from additional county departments which may impact on manpower during the daytime, may draw from departments already dispatched to the incident, requires reconfiguration in CAD, frequency issue still remains.
- 3. Reconfigure the current tender task force to be Cumberland-specific.
 - (+) Reduces response time, ability to operate on available radio frequencies,
 - (-) Draws from additional county departments which may impact during the daytime, may draw from departments already dispatched to the incident.
- 4. Reconfigure the task force into multiple elements geographically located within the county.
 - (+) May result in faster response, reduces the draw on available manpower during the daytime hours, requires CAD reconfiguration,
 - (-) Needs research to assess movement, required gallonage and assignment.

The Tender Task Force Committee will meet to discuss the courses of action in late December. Please provide your input, comments and ideas to Kevin Murphy at kmurphy1903@gmail.com no later than December 25, 2023.
