OLD BUSINESS

- 1. President Johnson advised that the channel template (Code Plugs) were being revised to accommodate our various models of radios. According to the HICAPS officials each model radio requires a specific code plug for the make and model. The quote is down to just slightly over \$6,000 dollars for the required work, and that is down from an original quote of \$21,000.00. President Johnson stated that they require Hex Keys for each talk group/channel, and we still need to get the Hex Keys for our additional operational channels obtained from the NCSHP. Mr. Randy Graham, Motorola HICAPS with the State of NC will be assisting us with the project. Once the code plugs are built, we still need to have the new code plugs downloaded into all radios (Approximately 600). We are already in the process of obtaining price quotes for the download phase, which requires the touch of each and every radio in our system.
- 2. President Johnson advised the technology committee looked into the feasibility concerning ruggedized computers versus non-ruggedized applications as well as tablets versus computers in regards to our approved purchase of additional electronic devices. President Johnson informed the membership that Chief McLamb, Deputy Chief Mitchell, himself and a representative from County IT visited Johnston County today and was very impressed with the Johnston County Freedom App tablet demonstration and gave an update of the capabilities of the application. President Johnson advised that the tablets were a third of the price of the MCT's. He stated that the core group will meet again over the next week or two and compile a list of required components in order to determine a final purchase price.
- 3. President Johnson thanked the Chiefs for submitting the name of their current training officer to the newly created chiefs training committee so that the better utilization of training resources can be conveyed to the entire county.
- 4. President Johnson stated that the active shooter class held on March 12, 2016 at the FTCC auditorium was attended by only nine (9) on Friday evening and only 14 people for the Saturday class. He stated that Friday night was specifically for dispatchers but a very informative class. He again stressed the preparations needed for an active shooter program.
- 5. President Johnson informed the membership that Tele-Communicators week is coming up in April and that the gifts purchased for this event had been received and given to Mr. Beeman

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. A poker run is being held for Fayetteville BC Ron Lewis on May 14, 2016 at Fort Bragg HD on Sycamore Dairy Rd. A flyer is in your packages, and he asked everyone to support the fund raising effort on behalf of Battalion Chief Ron Lewis.
- 2. President Johnson discussed the upcoming Chaplains program scheduled for August 8-12, 2016. Everyone please make your chaplains aware of this program and we will

provide additional information as we move closer to the class start date. The class is currently scheduled for City Station 14, but this may change. We will keep you informed.

3. President Johnson discussed the accident and the preliminary OSHA investigation into the injuries sustained by a Hoke County Fire Chief. Chief Michael Scott suffered serious burn injuries to his upper extremities as a result of not wearing his PPE at a ground cover fire which spread to a nearby shed. Fire conditions changed in a split second and without warning resulting in the abrupt injury. Chief Scott is back home and resting, but has a long recovery ahead of him. OSHA was on the scene in less than 8 hours and is looking into several issues to include PPE usage, department policies, training and command and control protocols. Once the final Department of Labor report is rendered, we will review the report in order to learn from the incident.
