TRAINING & EDUCATION - no report

SEMINAR - The seminar committee will begin planning for the 1997 Seminar, the first meeting is scheduled for July 17, 1996 at 7:00 p.m. in the mini conference room of the Neil Curry Building. STANDARDS & MUTUAL AID - no report

COMMUNICATIONS - no report

FINANCE & BUDGET - Chief Johnson stated that he has received the financial report from the County Finance Clerk. He will present the budget at the next meeting.

PUBLIC RELATIONS - Fire Marshall Ricky Strickland announced that the Fire Safe House previously owned by the Firefighters Association has been transferred to the Cumberland County Fire Marshal's Office; the unit will be transferred to the chiefs' association. Mr. Strickland distributed draft copies of the guidelines proposed by the Executive Committee. The unit is currently being housed at Pearce Mills Fire Department.

FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE - Advised that the foam contained in the foam trailer tanks is required to be tested annually. This test is \$50.00 per sample. The Fire Marshal will schedule the testing.

FAYETTEVILLE TECH. - Mr. Vile announced that the Fire Academy is scheduled to graduate on July 19, 1996. He also announced upcoming classes offered through the college.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT - Cheri Grabowski introduced Tommy Stevenson (FM2). Ms. Grabowski distributed Emergency Response Guidebooks to those present. She stated that any changes to the Resource Manual should be forwarded to her office as soon as possible as the manual is nearing completion.

E.O.C. - Dr. Henderson gave a presentation on the Emergency Medical Dispatch program that has been adopted by the county. Copies of the rules and regulations are available through NCEMA. Dr. Henderson also discussed the EMS program as it pertained to First Responders. Attorney Neil Yarborough discussed Charters and Contracts for those department participating in the first responder program. He advised that this is a voluntary program, departments wishing to participate should inform Doc so that they can be dispatched when needed.

REF: Proposed Computer Specifications for the Cumberland County Fire Service Network

Please review the attached Computer Specifications provided by GATEWAY 2000 for our proposed Fire Service Network. This proposed Network will link all Fire Departments and all agencies that work closely with the Cumberland County Fire Service. This state of the art computer will provide all essential programs, such as Word Processing, Financial Management and *PROPER CHIEF* to actively manage your fire department or agency. A printer will also be provided.

Services from the Internet such as the NC State Firemen's and Fire Chief's Association, International Association of Fire Chief's and other related services will also be made available to you through this proposed Network. This proposal if approved will place the Cumberland County Fire Service in the leading edge of technology and the first in the State of North Carolina to link its services County-wide.

The attached proposal includes a G6-200 Intel 200 MHz Pentium Pro Processor Network Server and a P5 Intel 166 MHz Pentium personal computer. We will propose to purchase one (1) server and (30) personal computers to be distributed within the fire service. The server will be stationed in the Fire Marshal's Office.

A complete proposal from the Budget Committee will be presented during the July 1996 meeting at Stoney Point on July 22, 1996.

MINUTES OF MEETING

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

June 19, 1996

The Executive Committee met in the Fire Marshal's Office at 2:30 p.m. to discuss the Fire Safe House.

Member's present were: President James E. Hall, Vice President Dick Dyre, Secretary Larry A. Wilson, Chief Freddy Johnson and Fire Marshal Ricky Strickland.

The executive committee was informed by Fire Marshal Rickey Strickland that the Fire Safe House purchased by the Cumberland County Firefighters Association through fund raisers had been turned over to the Fire Marshal's Office. Mr. Strickland's intentions were to maintain control of the trailer until transfer of the title had been completed. The Fire Safe House would then be transferred to the Cumberland County Fire Chiefs' Association.

Fire Marshal Strickland presented a copy of the proposed Guidelines. The Executive Committee reviewed these Guidelines and made recommended changes.

The committee also recommended that safety rules be established for use of the trailer. It was also recommended that a standard release form be used for individuals using the fire safe house.

The trailer is currently being housed at Pearces Mills Fire Department.

Fire Marshal Strickland advised that he would make the changes so it could be presented to the association on the next regularly scheduled meeting.

Meeting was adjourned at 15:00 hours.
