Treasurer's Report: Deputy Chief Johnson presented the Treasurer's report.

Meeting Point of interests:

Next Chief's Meeting will be hosted February 28, 2011 by Pearce's Mill Fire Department. The meeting will begin at 1900 hours. Dinner will be served.

- President Johnson briefly discussed the Chief 101 class held on January 21, 22 2011 at Stoney Point Elementary School. The class comments received was that the information was very beneficial and productive. As a result he is coordinating to bring in a FLSA Attorney to answer some lingering questions concerning this issue for our next Chief's only meeting.
- President Johnson advised that as part of our Professional Development we will conduct some short classes that will count towards our annual Officers training. During the March 2010 meeting at Cotton FD a Battalion Commander from the Salisbury Fire Department will be here to review their double LODD, the results and lessons learned.
- President Johnson handed out packets which contained; adopted honorary membership information, C.C. Chiefs committees and annexation information.
- President Johnson introduced Bradley Teague as the new Fire Chief for the Bethany Fire Department

- President Johnson presented a proclamation of lifetime membership to retired Fire Chief J.F. Hall for his years of dedicated service to the organization.
- President Johnson announced that Chief Hill was assisting the Fire Marshal's office with a Regional AFG Fire Prevention, Education & Safety Grant request for the integration of Fire House Web services and related programs.
- President Johnson briefly discussed the new air truck schedule for 2011.

OLD BUSINESS:

- President Johnson advised the association that he feels like he has exhausted all of his options in regards to paying back the grant money from 2006 that was used to purchase the extended warranties. It appears at this time that we will have to pay this money back.

NEW BUSINESS:

- There was discussion on the vehicle response policy. If you need to divert a dispatched unit to another call, please coordinate this with the stations involved so that the incident commander may request additional units or redirect his current units as needed.
- President Johnson discussed the annexation letter that is included in your packets. It is now being recommended that municipalities be required to provide services immediately upon the installation of the water lines. A contract can only be utilized during this time. President Johnson a member of the NC Annexation Study Committee will be going to Raleigh to discuss this proposal further on behalf of our association and all volunteer fire departments.
- Chief Pearce of EMS gave an informative overview of the new EMS unit deployment aspects. Through the use of geographic's, call volumes, peak time demand, AVL and staggered work schedules, his organization has been able to put more units on the street than ever before. Several Chiefs commented that it appears that this re-deployment is beneficial. Chief Pearce advised that there will be no more request for routine 17- A calls unless the situation with available units has become critical. He also advised that family members can now ride into the hospital with the patient as long as the staff on board feels safe with the situation.

In order to better utilize our Air resources the above listed Air Truck schedule will be utilized for both emergency and non-emergency air truck responses. Any requests for cascade filling require a 72 hour coordination notice and should be coordinated with the Fire Department having response responsibility for the indicated month. Special requests for training purposes must also be coordinated with the appropriate department.

All requests for **Emergency Air Supply** should be coordinated through the appropriate city/county dispatch center. For additional questions concerning the emergency air truck responses refer to the approved and adopted Air Truck Response Policy. In accordance with our approved Air Truck Response Policy only emergency response requests should be fielded after normal duty hours.¹

In the event that more than one (1) air supply truck is needed during an on-going or large incident the order of precedent is as follows: 1st - Unit on call for the month, 2nd - The next unit in line coming up next for monthly rotation, and follow that order until all resources are exhausted.

This schedule will remain in effect until superseded.



Honorary Life time membership rights for the Cumberland County Fire Chief's Association -


Must be a member of the Cumberland County Fire Departments for a minimum of twenty (20) years. Furthermore during this period he/she must have served as a Chief Officer for a minimum of five (5) years and apply to the President of the Association.


The following waiver of times should be considered on a case by case approval by all Chief Association voting members.

1. Non-fire related Medical Retirement must have a minimum of 15 years with the Cumberland County Fire Service and a minimum of 3 years as a Chief Officer.
2. Fire related Medical Retirement automatically receives the benefit.
3. Forced retirement due to Annexation of district by a municipality must have a minimum of 15 years with the Cumberland County Fire Service and a minimum of 3 years as a Chief Officer.
4. An individual associate member having completed twenty years of service with the association can apply for life time membership. The President of the Association will present the request to all voting members for a vote.

All approved honorary life time members will be exempt from the annual dues to the association. The secretary of the association will maintain a current roster of all approved life time members.

All other requests for honorary life time membership not covered above must be presented to the voting members of the association for approval.

Fire Service Comments concerning A Bill To Be Entitled An Act To Amend The Annexation Laws To Require Meaningful Services and Meaningful Oversight dated March 18, 2009.

My concerns stem from what appears to FORCE annexing municipalities to provide for varying services including Fire Protection on the date of annexation. I do not agree with this method as it applies to the fire service. 160A-47 Prerequisites to annexation; ability to serve; report and plans. (Page 2 Line 29 through 33. Furthermore it states that contracts with rural fire departments to provide fire protection shall be an acceptable method of providing fire protection only until such time as waterlines are made available in such areas under existing municipal policies for the extension of waterlines. Page 2 Line 36 through 42.

Addressing this issue, we must factor into account our current struggling economy, anticipated future budget cuts resulting from a 3.5 billion dollar budget shortfall and cuts in revenue sharing. In addition to these issues, rising insurance and pension costs are severely limiting budgets across our great state. All these issues affect operations and certainly annexation. This new proposal allows for duplication of services, does not allow for meaningful resource sharing, and does not allow our citizens timely and efficient fire and rescue services from the closest available unit. Our citizens expect and deserve from their perspective governments efficient, timely and vital fire services from the closest, available resources. This annexation proposal forces municipalities to duplicatively fund resources that are already in place (existing fire departments), and will force municipalities, especially with large scale annexations, to build fire stations within close proximity to fully functioning, rural fire stations already paid for with tax dollars by the very citizens being annexed. This is wasteful spending purely in the name of annexation.

Our annexation law must be developed with a resource sharing program in mind, especially in those areas where similar or like services already exist. The City of Fayetteville participates in resource sharing and dispatch by closest fire/rescue resource, regardless of jurisdictional lines and with the caveat that these rural departments meet established municipal standards & guidelines. This action resulted in seamless fire service and a tremendous tax savings to Fayetteville. (I want to point out that the City of Fayetteville was highly criticized for its 2004 Big Bang Annexation. Although criticized, they affected Fire Protection contracts with the annexed rural fire districts meeting COF standards which significantly enhanced resource sharing, fostered closest unit dispatch and significantly saved the tax payer money.)

There must be no reduction in fire, EMS and rescue services within a rural fire district as a result of annexation. The citizens deserve the best possible service. Reduction of fire protection services to unaffected citizens in a rural area as a result of annexation is not fair, nor is it just.

Volunteer fire departments have evolved considerably. The proposed annexation amendment lumps all volunteer fire departments into one volunteer category. I must point out that many rural fire departments have changed from an all volunteer department to a combination department consisting of both paid and volunteer members, and already have municipal ISO ratings meeting similar equipment and operational standards found at the larger city levels. In order to address efficient fiscal control, we must consider annexation contracts that emphasize resource sharing and long term roll over programs and initiatives that become effective after an established time period or after the majority of the rural fire department's area has been annexed. This allows efficient and timely fire service, not only in the annexed area but also continues the same level of service to the remaining rural district citizenry without curtailment of services due to revenue loss from a significant annexation.

I would very much like to meet and discuss this issue further as this will surely affect future rural fire departments as our counties and rural areas develop and grow. It's imperative that we address this issue and resolve it in the right manner.
