Old Business:

Internet: Chief James Hall met with Sprint. Sprint can provide Internet and email access for approximately \$90,000. This figure includes routers, phone lines, etc. He spoke with AIT, again. They propose to host a website at a cost of \$39 to setup and at \$18.95 per month per station with unlimited email access. Each station would need to sign in. AIT will not maintain the website. They recommend The Fayetteville Observer, which could run approximately \$400 - \$1,000 for setup and design. They would also provide Internet access and ISDN lines for \$27.90 set up fee and \$27.90 per month to include 5 email accounts. Dial up connections will cost an additional \$13.95 per month. They will not provide access to roadrunner. Research is also being done on the domain name. A domain name will cost \$7.99 per year, with a maximum 2-year registration. Basic service can be provided to each station. The potential is there to tie in Firehouse.

A second proposal was made by Fire Marshall Ricky Strickland to buy 3 56K Modems at approximately \$100 per modem to install in the county server, phone installation, and monthly phone billing at approximately \$30 per month paid for my the CCFCA will provide email and internet access for each station. The best part of this proposal is the State is on the same system. The Firehouse program would have its own address. There was a discussion of the data remaining on the server.

Motion was made by Chief Sudia, seconded by Chief Bullard, to begin Internet and email access through the Cumberland County IS Dept. Unanimous decision.

OC Spray Decontamination

Armor Holdings Incorporated, the manufacturer of Oleoresin Capsicum Spray (OC), has advised that emergency medical personnel should no longer use saline solution to flush the eyes of sprayed individuals. The company states that there could be a reaction between the saline and agents in the OC. They are recommending that only sterile water be used for this purpose.

Please notify your emergency medical responders of this change in decontamination procedures, and no longer use saline solution when assisting law enforcement agencies with decontamination of suspects that are sprayed with OC.
