- President Johnson advised that the City of Fayetteville (COF) Fire Department has the air truck duties for June with Grays Creek # 24 picking up in July.

OLD BUSINESS:

 President Johnson stated that the Association paid the Piedmont Fire Association dues for 2011 & 2012 for each department. President Johnson talked about the CCFCA Group that he created on his lamresponding.com system. This allows him to send out one text or e-mail to all the members at one time. He stated that everyone should have received a reminder notice about the Association meeting about 2 hours before the scheduled meeting. He asked all those in attendance that have not provided their cell phone number and provider name to do so.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. President Johnson Sr. presented a retirement plaque to retiring Emergency Management Officer Charles Gregory Phillips, with the Cumberland County Emergency Services Department. Greg is retiring after 30 years of service to the county working as a dispatcher and most recently as an Emergency Management Officer. President Johnson thanks Greg for his service to the Cumberland County Fire, Rescue and Medical Services.
 - 2. President Johnson stated that Fire Chief Wayne Lucas with the Godwin/Falcon Fire Department send out an inquiry about the fast approaching VHF Narrow Banding deadline of January 1, 2013. Chief Johnson stated that the hand-out in every ones packet addresses narrow banding requirements and provides a list of radios that most of us may have in our inventory that will not be narrow banding capable. We primarily utilize VHF for dispatch and notification purposes. Several years ago we adopted the 800 MHz VIPER radio system as our primary radio system within Cumberland County in order to meet established Interoperable communication requirements. Therefore he urged all departments to maintain and renew their VHF license and re-program those radios that meet the new guidelines for back-up purposes.
 - 3. Chief Kevin Herndon (GCFD#18) brought up and inquired about hiring an attorney concerning Fire Department Staff volunteering. With no further input President Johnson asked Chief Herndon to bring this issue up at the up-coming Finance Committee meeting to be conducted in the next two (2) weeks.

Kent Langdon, NCDOT, welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked them for their participation. Everyone introduced themselves to the group.

Matthew Harris, NCDOT Construction, provided the following status of the following construction projects:

- SR 1141 (Cumberland Rd.) Directional leftover and 2' monolithic concrete island to be placed between Wingate Rd. and John Smith Rd. Start date began April 19, 2011 and should complete by May 15, 2011. Expect lane closures between 8:30 and 4:00, Monday thru Friday.
- SR 2299 (Russell St.) Work description includes grading, drainage, milling, paving, and signals.
 Lanes are now open to traffic. The final layer of asphalt has been placed but will be milling areas with ponding of water issues to correct. Once this is completed final pavement marking will be installed.

- SR 1003 (Camden Rd.) Pavement widening from NC 59 to NC 162. Expect lane closures and delays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Project completion is scheduled for June 15, 2012. Phase I (SBL) should be complete in July, with project completion scheduled for June 15, 2012.
- SR 1363 (Elk Rd.) From SR 1132 (Legion Rd.) to US 301. Project completion is scheduled for September 2012. Expect lane closures and delays from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Project is ahead of schedule.
- NC 24/87 (Bragg Blvd) from US 401 Byp. to north of SR 1437 (Santa Fe Dr./Shaw Rd.). Description of work includes grading, drainage, paving, widening, clearing and grubbing, signals, and overhead signing. This work is scheduled to be performed at night. Project will be let June 15, 2011 with the availability on August 26th. The project is scheduled for completion in October 2012.
- SR 1112 (Stoney Point Rd.) at SR 1108 (Lakewood Dr.) Intersection improvements: Widening for
 right turn lanes, curb & gutter and signal revisions. Project started April 19, 2011 and is scheduled to
 be complete May 20, 2011. Project will involve lane closures.

Randy Wise, NCDOT Construction, provided the status of the following construction projects:

- Future I-295 (Fayetteville Outer Loop) Project is approximately 60% complete. Structure and roadway embankment are being constructed between Bragg Blvd. and Murchison Rd. on new alignment. Project completion is scheduled for July 2012.
- NC 210 (Murchison Rd.) Widening of NC 210 north of the future Outer Loop and interchange with Honeycutt Rd. Expect lane closures intermittently. Project completion is scheduled for July 2012. Structure and roadway embankments are being constructed near Honeycutt Rd. Contractor is currently working on widening of Murchison Rd. and bridge over Honeycutt Rd.
- US 401 (Ramsey St.) Median island and widening construction along US 401, from Law Rd. and Farmers Rd. Expect lane closures from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Utilities adjustments are ongoing. Construction of bulb-outs have started in the northbound lane. Once northbound lane work has been completed contractor will begin southbound then work in the median section.
- Future I-295 (Fayetteville Outer Loop) Clearing along Murchison Rd. and Ramsey St. has begun. Project completion is scheduled for April 2014.

Bill Hammond, NCDOT Maintenance, provided the status of the following maintenance projects:

- SR 2299 (Russell St.) From Gillespie St. to bridge at Blount's Creek. Will be installing a liner in the storm drain line. Work began 8/2/10 and should be completed 6/30/11.
- Tornado Cleanup on various routes throughout the county.

Darren Pittman, NCDOT Bridge, provided the status of the following projects in Cumberland County:

• 1-95 Bus./US 301 @ SBL - Bridge/beam repair. Expect lane closures from 4/29 to 5/1.

• SR 1007 (All American Freeway) - Heat straightening of beams will take place near the end of April. Expect lane closures.

Kent Langdon discussed the raised marker contract and provided a list of roads that will have markers installed in Cumberland County. This work will be performed between April 1st and July 31st.

Rusty Thompson, City of Fayetteville, discussed the status of storm debris, disposal site and estimated quantities. Stated that approximately 45% storm debris pickup is complete. Stated Chesapeake Bay Rd. in the College Lakes Subdivision will be closed in approximately 2-4 weeks and will remain closed during the replacement of a culvert which is scheduled to be complete within 90 days after closure.

The team discussed the following general topics:

- NC 24/210 (Grove St.) and US 301 project to install fencing in the medians to reduce pedestrian fatalities.
- April Tornado Review team members stated 211 was a number for assistance related to the storm damage. Appreciation was expressed by many of the team members concerning the aftermath of the storms.
- Outer Loop Construction from Ramsey to Murchison Rd. reviewed an article from the observer regarding type of construction, duration and cost.
- Operation Slow Down Discussed an article with more than 17,000 citations in a 7 day period by the NCSHP. The article reviewed the breakdown of citations: speeding, seat belt, registration violations, driving left of center, equipment violations, driving while impaired, reckless driving, and child restraint violations.
- I-95 Incident Pullover sites Discussed estimated number of locations, type of pull off and costs associated with project.
- Moped Crash Data 10 years of data was reviewed.
- I-95 Bus/US 301 RXR closing review Project was utilized from Russell St. to Gillespie St. Some concerns were expressed with multiple projects ongoing at the same time.

The team reviewed the following incidents:

- A. A fatal incident occurred Wednesday, February 23rd on US 301 at the intersection of Old Wilmington Rd. A motorist ran a red light southbound on Old Wilmington Rd. and struck a northbound vehicle on US 301.
- B. A fatal incident occurred on Saturday March 5th on Waldo's Beach Rd. An individual had been at a party and left to take a young lady for a drive in his new car. He missed a curve and ran off the left side of the road into the ditch, hit a tree, slid, and the driver's side door hit a utility pole. (Speed and alcohol were involved).

- C. A fatal incident occurred on Sunday, March 6th on Ramsey St. A young driver was maneuvering thru traffic, crossed into oncoming traffic and collided with a pickup truck near Methodist College. Wet roads were a contributing factor.
- D. A fatal incident occurred on Tuesday, March 8th on Bragg Blvd. A moped driver hit a utility pole at the intersection of Swain St. The driver was leaving a nearby strip development and collided with the utility pole.
- E. An incident occurred on Thursday, March 10th at the intersection Bragg Blvd. and Odell Rd. Two students and a driver were hurt when a pickup truck hit a bus. The incident created traffic delays on Bragg Blvd.
- F. A fatal incident occurred on Saturday, March 12th on North Reilly Rd. An individual on a motorcycle left a parking lot at a high rate of speed and crashed into a pickup turning into Reilly Rd. Farmers Market. The driver of the pickup was intoxicated, but did not cause the incident. Charges are pending. The motorcycle driver did not have an endorsement.
- G. A fatal incident occurred on Thursday, March 17th at the intersection of Owen Dr. and Village Dr. The driver for a delivery truck was not paying attention, ran a red light and collided with a pickup truck.
- H. A fatal incident occurred on Tuesday, March 22nd on Camden Rd. An eastbound vehicle crossed the center line, ran off the road to the left, overcorrected, ran off the road to the right, struck several trees and overturned. (No seatbelt) Upcoming spot safety project to install 2' paved shoulders.
- A three vehicle incident occurred Tuesday, March 22nd at the intersection of Cliffdale Rd. and Water's Edge Dr. A corridor study has been requested by a council member.
- J. A shooting incident occurred Tuesday, March 22nd on Bragg Blvd. A vehicle rear-ended another vehicle. The driver at fault shot two individuals in the other vehicle and left the scene. Traffic was detoured during the investigation. The father and daughter that were shot were transported to the hospital with multiple bullet wounds.
- K. A fatal incident occurred on Monday, March 28th at the intersection of Skibo Rd. ad Legend Ave. It is believed the driver on Legend Ave. was a newly experienced driver of a manual transmission and failed to stop at the intersection, traveling into the path of vehicles across the intersection.
- L. An incident occurred Monday, March 28th at the intersection of Boone Trail and Roxie Avenue. Fuel and antifreeze leaked out. No injuries were reported.
- M. A suicide occurred Monday, March 28th on All American Freeway. The incident closed the southbound lanes during the investigation.
- N. An incident occurred Thursday, April 7th on US 401, near Linden. A truck hauling an A/C unit became unhitched and slammed head on into a vehicle in the opposing lane. The driver was taken to Betsy Johnson Regional Hospital for treatment.

- O. A pedestrian fatality occurred on Thursday, April 7th on Monticello Avenue. An impaired pedestrian was walking with traffic and was struck by a vehicle which left the scene and contacted police some two or three hours later.
- P. A fatality occurred Friday, April 15th on Hummingbird Place. The driver of the vehicle traveled off the road to the right, overcorrected, crossed the center line, traveled off the road to the left and struck a ditch. (Speeding and no seatbelt were factors).
- Q. A motorcycle fatality occurred Saturday, April 23rd on Seventy First School Rd. A vehicle turned in front of the motorcycle onto Bunce Rd. The driver of the vehicle left the scene of the accident. Police are still searching for the driver.
- R. A fatality occurred Saturday, April 16th on Stoney Point Rd. The driver was traveling southeast, ran off the road to the right and hit a tree near Syke Pond Rd.

Narrowbanding



The FCC report and order requires that all wideband - only VHF and UHF radios and infrastructure be replaced with narrowband-capable equipment prior to 2013.

Key Dates:

January 1, 2011: The FCC will no longer accept applications for new VHF or UHF systems that operate on wideband channels (25 KHz or more).

January 1, 2011: The FCC will no longer accept applications for modification of VHF or UHF systems that operate on wideband channels (25 KHz).

January 1, 2013: All existing licenses must operate on channels with a bandwidth of 12.5 KHz or less (narrowband). Failure to comply with the January 1, 2013 deadline results in cancellation of license.

Radio equipment manufacturers have been aware of the pending narrowband mandate since 1997 and most of the equipment purchased in the last five years will be capable of changing to narrowband operation simply by reprogramming. The following list of Motorola radios that may still be in service are NOT narrowband capable.

The FCC Narrowbanding Mandate: What You Need to Know to Assure Radio Communications in 2013



What is Narrowbanding?

Private land mobile radio (LMR) systems - including municipal government and State and local public safety systems - use blocks of radio spectrum called channels. Historically, LMR systems have used 25 kHz-wide channels. In December 2004, the Federal Communications Commission mandated that all private LMR users operating between 150 and 512 MHz move to 12.5 kHz narrowband voice channels and highly efficient data channel operations by January 1, 2013. This migration complements a National Telecommunications and Information Administration mandate for more rapid Federal agency migration to 12.5 kHz narrowband operation by January 1, 2008. The earlier Federal deadline affects State and local FCC licensees that interface or share frequencies with Federal radio systems.




Figure 1: Narrowband channels allow additional channels to exist in the same spectrum.

Using narrowband channels will ensure that agencies take advantage of more efficient technology and, by reducing channel width, will allow additional channels to exist within the same spectrum space, as illustrated in figure 1.

Who is Affected:

The FCC Narrowbanding rules affect all operators of land mobile radios (LMR) that use channels between:

- 150 and 174 MHz
- 421 and 512 MHz

Deadlines / Key Dates:

To phase in the migration deadline of January 1, 2013, the FCC has established interim deadlines.

The first important deadline is January 1, 2011 after which:

- The FCC will not grant applications for new voice operations or applications to expand the authorized contour of existing stations that use 25 kHz channels. Only narrowband authorizations will be granted.
- New system applications must be 12.5 kHz or less
- No 25 kHz system expansion permitted
- MOTOTRBO™ meets this requirement

January 1, 2013

- All existing licenses must operate on channels with a bandwidth of 12.5 KHz or less (narrowband). Failure to comply with the January 1, 2013 deadline may result in cancellation of license.
- I/B and PS 150-512 MHz incumbents must migrate to 12.5/12.5 kHz (e) or less
- The FCC will prohibit manufacture or importation of new equipment that operates on 25 kHz channels.
- New equipment submitted for FCC type-acceptance must be cabable of operating in 6.25 kHz mode.
- It is unclear what happens to licensed 25 kHz systems after this date certain

Land Mobile Radio Systems still using wideband channels as of January 1, 2013, risk the following:

- Loss of Radio Communications
- · Substantial FCC Fines
- · Revocation of FCC Licenses

Planning for the Move to Narrowband

Land Mobile Radio System Operators (both public safety and nonpublic safety) need to aggressively develop a strategy to meet narrowband deadlines to avoid cancellation of existing wideband FCC authorizations. Although the migration deadline may seem far off, the long lead time and interim deadlines make it necessary for you to plan well in advance.

Assess Current Equipment and Start Planning.

To prepare for the migration, organizations should start assessing their radio systems and planning for replacements or upgrades. They should inventory their current equipment to ascertain what can be converted to 12.5 kHz and what will need to be replaced before January 1, 2013. Most new equipment has the capability for both 25 kHz and 12.5 kHz operation because any VHF/UHF radio equipment accepted by the FCC after February 14, 1997, had to have 12.5 kHz capability. The 12.5 kHz narrowband equipment is available in both conventional analog FM and digital formats (such as Project 25), so narrowband conventional FM systems will be compliant. Local governments should develop contingency plans to accommodate system changes for both public safety and nonpublic safety systems.

Obtain New or Modified Licenses.

To move to narrowband operations, organizations must apply for new frequencies or modify existing licenses. An organization that is licensed for a 25 kHz-wide channel is not guaranteed two 12.5 kHz channels. Licensees will have to justify to the FCC why they need additional channels. Consideration of applications for new narrowband licenses will follow the same process as a new license application. As organizations migrate to narrowband operation, however, the pool of available frequencies will increase.

Motorola Radios that are Not Narrowband Capable

Radio equipment manufacturers have been aware of the pending narrowband mandate since 1997 and most of the equipment purchased in the last five years will be capable of changing to narrowband operation simply by reprogramming.







Please note that some older versions of the HT1000 and VISAR portable radios are programmable for narrowband only on existing channels. However, they may not be compatible if new narrowband frequencies are added.

To meet later mandates planned by the FCC, consider new equipment that is capable of 6.25 kHz channels. These very narrowband systems are digital – your license should specify digital operations prior to use of this equipment.


