### Minutes of June 28, 2010 Monthly Meeting

The meeting was hosted by the Fayetteville Fire Department. We thank Chief Nichols and his staff for their hospitality.

**Opening Prayer:** Chief J.F. Hall provided the opening prayer.

**Roll Call:** Roll call was conducted with 23 departments and 11 associate members present.

**Members Absent:** None

**Associate Members Absent:** NC Forestry

**Approval of Minutes:** Minutes from the May 24, 2010 meeting were approved as presented.

**Guests:** Pat Webb, Office of NC EMS, discussed issues regarding vehicle inspections, EMT credentialing, con-ed audits, and properly stocked units. She also reminded everyone to remain professional and not to respond to incidents after consuming alcohol.

**Next Chief's Meeting** will be held July 26, 2010 at EMS base. The meeting will begin at 7:00 pm.

- President Johnson advised the members that the Archie Cox fundraiser went well and that additional donations would be appreciated.
- President Johnson handed out packets which contained; budget information, NIMS training requirements and a press release on the adopted county budget.
- President Johnson stated that the Hoke County Ethanol plant is scheduled to open on July 15, 2010 pending permits. An email will follow in regards to the scheduled open public safety house.
- Captain Shultz with the Spring Lake Fire Department passed away. Please keep his family in your prayers. An e-mail announcing his arrangements will be sent out tomorrow 6-29-2010.

- Chief Hodges briefed everyone on the Hope Mills 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade being held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of July at 0900 hours. He also thanked everyone for their assistance on the Andy's structure fire this past week.
- Director Currie gave an update on some recent 911 legislation regarding funding. He also requested that we continue to provide data in regards to busy signals and dead areas concerning the use of 800 MHz radios. He stated that units on the fire ground that have problems with busy signals should use channel 11a. To solve the problem additional channels must be installed in various locations throughout Cumberland County to eliminate the current busy signals. President Johnson urged all members to really pay attention to their communications capabilities out on a fire ground and take immediate action in case they cannot fully communicate with all units on the fire ground. This is a serious problem with potentially serious consequences under the right set of unfortunate circumstances. Everyone raise your communications awareness and keep our firefighters safe.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- President Johnson discussed the disbursements of the special fire tax fund. The County Commissioners are requesting additional oversight over the funding.
- President Johnson stated that the Welcome Fire Department in Davidson County would like to have our old Fire Safety House for their department. A motion was made by Assistant Chief Sean Johnson and seconded by Deputy Chief Hank Harris to donate this house to the Welcome Fire Department. The motion passed by a unanimous roll call vote.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- President Johnson is working with Deputy Chief Harris in regards to a defect with the new fire safety trailer. Surrey Fire Safety House has been notified and we are awaiting an answer concerning the issue.
- President Johnson presented a Firehouse Web-Cast titled **"Rapid Intervention Reality of Your FD – What Grade will They Get on Their Report Card"** He stated that all of us collectively need to do a better job when it comes to RIT and recognize the importance of this critical FF safety measure. Employing a RIT is not a matter of **IF** but rather an issue of **WHEN** and statistics have shown a Mayday often occurs when you least expect it. It is absolutely essential that every Fire Chief discuss in detail our county-wide Mayday SOG with their entire membership, and insure that each member of our fire service is familiar with the SOG, as well as the term **LUNAR** and everyone knows our radio emergency procedures. All of us including our dispatchers need to be very familiar with the requirements of a MAYDAY. President Johnson asked each member to grade your own department during the Web-Cast. Finally he stated that it was also important that if your department is dispatched to a RIT assignment to send only qualified firefighters and if you cannot make the assignment let someone know in order to take immediate action. A

training form was passed around for all members present to sign in order to receive training credit. This will count towards our annual professional development training and ISO Officer Training requirements.

- President Johnson requested that the Communications Committee prepare an SOG regarding the use of a tactical radio channel for the Last Call due to a Firefighter death.

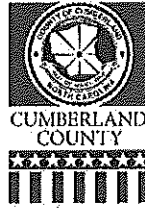

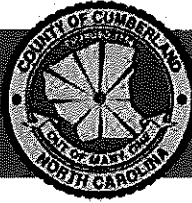

## Commissioners Adopt FY2011 Budget

FAYETTEVILLE – The Cumberland County Board of Commissioners adopted the FY2011 budget tonight during their regular meeting.

The general fund budget totals \$285,954,486 and includes a property tax rate of 74 cents per \$100 valuation, a reduction of 2.6 cents from the current rate of 76.6 cents. The county has earmarked six-tenths of a penny of the county-wide tax rate, which is expected to total \$1.2 million, for a jail expansion capital project. The commissioners also approved transferring \$1.8 million from the designated Health Department renovation reserve to the jail expansion reserve, bringing that new line item to \$3 million.

The budget also includes a 2 percent cost-of-living pay increase for permanent county employees hired before June 20. The raise is effective beginning with the first full pay period in July.

The commissioners, based on the recommendation of the Public Safety Task Force, increased the special fire service fire district tax to 1.25 cents, a three-fourths of a cent increase, in order to raise the minimum funding level from all sources to \$250,000 for five low-wealth departments (Beaver Dam, Bethany, Godwin/Falcon, Stedman, and Wade). This also provides additional funding for the Fire Chiefs' Association, which will benefit all volunteer fire departments.

The adopted budget includes funding for the county's new Child Support Department. The state eliminated funding for the state-operated Child Support Enforcement offices in 28 counties, including Cumberland, effective July 1. First-year funding is set at \$3.8 million, with a projected revenue offset of about \$2.8 million, for an estimated net cost to the county of \$1 million.

If additional information is needed regarding this matter please feel free to give me a call. Thank you for your continued support of the Wade Community Fire Department.

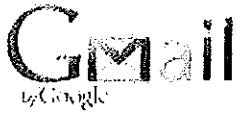
