- Call to Order:** The meeting was called to order by President Johnson at 7 pm.
- Opening Prayer:** Chaplain Tatum provided the opening prayer.
- Pledge of Allegiance:** President Johnson led the members with the pledge of allegiance.
- Roll Call:** Roll call was conducted with 18 departments and 8 associate members present.

Next Chief's Meeting will be Monday, February 25, 2019 at Cotton FD, with dinner.

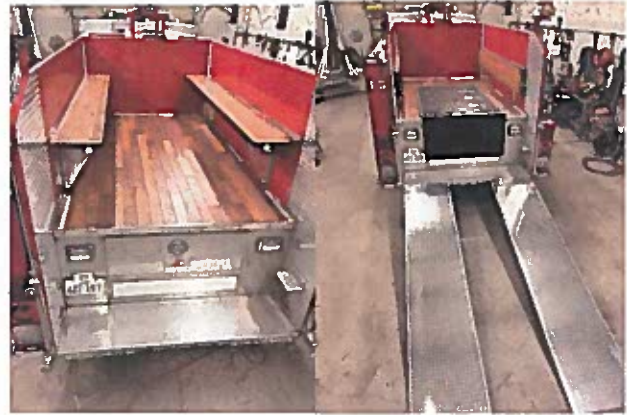
- Fayetteville FD Air 100 has the air truck responsibilities during the month of February followed by Grays Creek VFD 2461 in March 2019.

OLD BUSINESS

1. President Johnson stated that Mark Gordon (Graphics Designer) will be here next week Tuesday to put the final graphic on our Mobile Command & Communications Bus "COMS-1". This will be placed strategically on all four sides of the bus. Integrated Network Associates, (INA) LLC, out of Southern Pines is assisting us with the final project on the bus that will allow us to stream internet. We will also have to activate through First NET the phone and tablet services.
2. Chief Nobles provided a final update on the Agricultural and Forestry study committee which was concluded with no action taken. He stated at a meeting earlier this morning a meeting occurred with Senator Jackson from Sampson County, a bill sponsor who also informed us that the study committee has stopped its work with no action taken.
3. President Johnson discussed the Freedom App that can be used on a smart phone. He stated that we can make the Freedom App available to Chief Officers. If you would like this APP, please contact President Johnson so we can get the proper links and information out in order to download the program on your smart phone.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Dr. Larry Keen, President Fayetteville Technical Community College (FTCC) – Announced the kick-off for a new regional fire and rescue training facility on about 29 acres of land in the industrial park. The land was donated by Cumberland County and this regional training facility is for use by all Cumberland County Fire and Rescue agencies and will also host regional as well as statewide users. He showed architectural drawings and a 3D video of the new 18 million dollar project. – Commissioner Keefe thanked Dr. Keen and FTCC for their commitment to our services and presented him with a firefighter knife.
2. Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Christine Michaels with the Greater Area Fayetteville Chamber talked about the 2019 Valor Awards breakfast scheduled for June 25, 2019 again at Manna Church. She handed out the 2019 award nomination forms along with an information packet concerning this year's event. (Handouts were provided in the January meeting packets) More information will be disseminated as we get closer to the event.
3. Dale Moushon with Department of Homeland and Security provided an in-depth overview of the Government Emergency Tele-communications Services (GETS) card, and how to sign up and obtain these cards. These cards will provide us priority service on the system in the event of an emergency that causes system wide overload. Even with members on First NET we will still require the card to get priority to make a call. He provided additional handouts and contact information.
4. President Johnson discussed the upcoming Caisson truck project and showed pictures to the membership of what he envisioned for the truck. This truck will be available once completed to all association members on request on a first come first service basis. Priorities will go towards line of duty deaths, active duty deaths and retired deaths followed by other special events. The truck will not be lettered and instead we will use magnetic signs to display the using department's name. He stated that hopefully we will be able to start this project within the next several months. He will report on the progress once the project has started. Most of the work will be done in-house.



5. President Johnson stated that we will have a photo shoot make up sometimes in April. This will provide us the opportunity to update our individual photos and include new members of the association. More details will be provided as we move closer to the makeup shoot.
6. Lifetime membership applications have been received from both retired Chiefs Kenneth Hall and Harold Shirley. Both meet our lifetime membership prerequisites and will be inducted by proclamation during our February meeting at the Cotton Fire Department on February 25, 2019.
7. President Johnson stated that Dispatcher Frazee retired from the county after many years of service as a dispatcher. Frazee is also a member of the Stedman Fire Department and he asked Chief Nobles to have Dispatcher Frazee to attend the February 2019 meeting at the Cotton Fire Department.
8. President Johnson informed the membership that County Ranger Craig Gottfried is undergoing surgery tomorrow and will be out for the next several months recovering. He will be out for the entire 2019 fire season. Because District Ranger Goode moved one of our ranger positions we only have two (2) plow operators available to us. After a discussion a **MOTION** was introduced by Chief Hodges to compensate and automatically dispatch one (1) additional Brush Unit when the forestry readiness plan reaches a 3. The motion was **SECONDED** by Adam Johnson and **APPROVED** by all members present. Adam will implement the procedure.
9. President Johnson reviewed the junior member live burn standard adopted by the North Carolina Fire and Rescue Commission. Junior members are restricted from participating in any live burn evolutions until they reach their 18th birthday. Additional information was provided in everyone's monthly packet.
10. Chief Brock informed the membership that his department was able to obtain a fire truck donation from the Inter-County Volunteer Fire Department in Pasquotech County. The 1995 Freightliner Fire Truck was delivered to Beaver Dam earlier this month. Both Beaver Dam and the Association is planning on thanking the Inter-County Volunteer Fire Department in the near future for their very kind donation to the Beaver Dam Fire Department.
11. President Johnson briefly talked about the passing of retired Fire Chief Vance Melvin from the Eastover Fire Department. Chief Melvin was an active member of the association in the 1970's and 80's before retiring in 1990. Our honor guard participated in his wake and memorial service.

- Assistant County Manager Jackson introduced our new Emergency Services Director Gene Booth, and briefly talked about the new Emergency Services Building purchased by Cumberland County behind the Harris Teeter on Raeford Road. He stated that the 17000 + square foot building will undergo some needed renovations that may take up to 18 months to complete. He stated that the City of Fayetteville was asked to consider co-locating or consolidation of our 9-1-1 centers. They are waiting on an answer from the City of Fayetteville. A tour of the building for all the chiefs will be scheduled
- Tracy also addressed budget figures for the coming 2019-20 fiscal year. Figures provided were formulated from data much gather much earlier due to a much earlier budget process start this year. These figures will be updated as periodically throughout the process.

- President Johnson addressed the increasing incidents where MAYDAYS are being called. He reviewed our local policy and asked the chiefs to discuss this with their membership otherwise we will have communications issues on the fire ground. It will take radio discipline to mitigate a successful MAYDAY call. Our policy is that a member involved in the MAYDAY remains on the assigned talk-group while all others immediately switch to our emergency talk-groups located on either end of the talk-group or channel selector switch.
- Assistant Chief Sean Johnson explained about using the emergency button on our radios and provided some background concerning a recent trooper involved shooting and the communications issues that evolved during the incident. He stated that the emergency buttons installed on our portable radios if properly utilized and activated will allow the firefighter involved in the MAYDAY open communication without interference from other users on the same talk group.
- President Johnson stated that several Chiefs will be attending the NCAFC Mid-Winter Conference in Concord scheduled through the end of this week.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made to adjourn by Chief Murphy and seconded by Captain Devane.
The meeting was adjourned at 2120 hours.

A packet of information is included which details the awards and the nomination process. Awardees will be selected by a civilian committee with an advisory group of fire, law enforcement, and EMS professionals guiding them. **Nominations are due by April 1.**

Awardees and their agency heads or supervisors will attend the event as our guests. There will be a special public safety ticket price for friends and family. The public will attend to say thank you.

We hope you will support this event by recognizing those in your department with a nomination. I have personally run a similar event in three other communities where I have worked, and it was met with much appreciation and success.

Award Descriptions

June 25, 2019 will see the second staging of The Greater Fayetteville Chamber's landmark community event – the Public Safety Valor Awards. This event is presented by Highland Construction and Restoration and Manna Church to show community appreciation to our first responders in the City, County and at Fort Bragg. This breakfast event will be from 7:30-9:30AM at Manna Church, 5117 Cliffdale Rd, Fayetteville.

Honorees may be nominated by their chief or agency head from any law enforcement, fire/rescue, and emergency management agency, regarding an incident that occurred within Cumberland County in the past year. Please note that several individuals may be nominated in different categories for the same incident, based on the role they played.

Valor Award

The highest award for valor and heroism. Awarded in cases in which a public safety official knowingly places themselves at risk of death or extreme serious bodily harm in the performance of an official act.

Lifesaving Award

To be awarded in recognition of official acts taken in a life-threatening situation where an individual's life is in jeopardy, either medically or physically.

Award of Merit

To recognize outstanding public safety work which demonstrates initiative, ingenuity, and/or diligence in the performance of his/her duties. Ex: Creating a new program or process, solving a cold case, detective work over a long period of time on a major initiative, etc.



Nomination Form

Please attach a narrative describing the circumstances surrounding the event for which you are making a nomination. Be sure to detail the unique circumstances in which this individual performed his/her duty over and above the line of duty. Do not only attach an incident report; incident reports may be used to supplement the information you provide. Please submit a separate coversheet for each person involved in an incident with multiple nominees. Maximum of 2 pages. All nomination forms are due to the Chamber by April 1, 2019 electronically. All forms must include a professional headshot of each nominee – nominations will be considered incomplete without it. No late or incomplete entries will be accepted.
